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In the **Abstract**, corrections to the values in the **Results** paragraph of the abstract were not implemented. This has been corrected to read:

“Results: The mediation analysis showed that a significant indirect relationship between interparental conflict and suicidal ideation, mediated by life satisfaction ($\beta = 0.02$, 95% CI [0.01, 0.04]). The moderation analysis revealed that teacher support moderated the relationship between life satisfaction and suicidal ideation ($\beta = -0.03$, $p < 0.01$). The relationship between life satisfaction and suicidal ideation was significant for adolescents who perceived high teacher support ($\beta = -0.08$, 95% CI [-0.12, -0.04]) but not for those who perceived low teacher support ($\beta = -0.01$, 95% CI [-0.05, 0.03]).”
